













# Who is likely to leave childhood HH?

- Co-residing adult children (21-35) are likely to be financially dependent (68.3%) and never married (94.3%). On the other hand,
- Adult children who left 36.5% remain financially dependent, and 63.7% are neither married nor cohabiting.

### Economic flow models

#### Two models found:

- · The economic stable model
  - The wealth flows from parent to children when children are young, a long period of lull; then a windfall when wealth finally flow from parents to children in the form of inheritances

# Economic Flow Models (contd.)

- · Economically vulnerable model
  - Wealth flow from parents when they are young
  - Children expected to send remittances to parents
  - Parents assist children during economic and social crisis
